Herman Ouseley became Chairman of the Commission for Racial Equality (CRE) in April 1993, having previously worked continuously in various areas of the public services since 1963. His most recent posts include Chief Executive of the London Borough of Lambeth between 1990-1993; Chief Executive of the Inner London Education Authority (ILEA) 1988-1990; Director of Education ILEA 1986-1988.

As Chairman for the CRE, Herman Ouseley is responsible for the direction and effective operations of the CRE in line with its statutory duties under the Race Relations Act 1976 to tackle racial discrimination and bring about racial equality and better race relations in Britain.

He has restructured and refocused the CRE through a new range of impact programmes designed to make the organisation better understood as a law enforcement body and to be more responsive, flexible and effective in meeting the equality expectations of the nation.

In addition to his full time tasks as Executive Chairman of the CRE, Herman Ouseley is involved with many other organisations and community based initiatives.
